Curriculum and Organisation of Education & Teaching Methods at the School

Pupils are taught by a qualified teacher in fifteen classes. All classes from Nursery to Year 2 have at least one teaching assistant to support individuals or groups within each class. All classes from Years 3-6 have at least one teaching assistant within each year group. This includes supporting pupils with additional learning needs.

In each class, pupils are taught a curriculum based on Curriculum for Wales 2022, using a range of suitable teaching approaches.

Pupils with additional learning needs may require additional support. This is given in the classroom, including small group and targeted intervention support. Additional support is provided in line with the ALN Reform guidelines.

PPA (Planning/Preparation/Assessment) cover for teachers is carried out by qualified teaching staff. One of the teacher's delivers a curriculum based on Expressive Arts to pupils from Nursery to Year 6. This teacher also supports the school choir and extracurricular music activities. The second teacher specialises in Outdoor Learning and delivers this aspect of the curriculum from Reception to Year 6.

Language Category of the School

Johnstown Primary School is an English medium school, however, pupils are taught to develop their Welsh bilingual skills in every year group. This is based on the WESP categorisation.

Toilet Facilities

Toilet facilities at the school are in good order and cleaned to a high standard on a daily basis.

Healthy Eating & Drinking

Healthy eating and drinking by pupils of the school is promoted regularly through:

- Healthy School status
- Discouragement of fizzy drinks, crisps and chocolate in lunchboxes
- Fruit eaten during break times brought in from home
- Healthy eating is part of the Health and Well-being curriculum
- Trip letters encourage healthy lunch boxes
- Three water fountains around the school for pupils
- Aspects of cooking being taught across the curriculum

School Development Plan

School Development Plan priorities for 2024-2027 are:

1	To strengthen leadership at all levels to improve the quality of self-evaluation processes, with particular focus on the monitoring of Welsh and Digital skills.
2	To strengthen the wellbeing and attitudes to learning of pupils with particular respect to Progression Step 3.
3	To refine the mapping of provision for skills across the curriculum, with a strong focus on further strengthening pupil progress in mathematical reasoning approaches.
4	To strengthen parental engagement through enhancing relationships and restorative approaches.
5	To ensure a consistent approach to self and peer assessment to support learner effectiveness.
